

Poster Activities A (for less advanced students)

Small Class

Really Hungry

- Stand in front of the class and say to a student *I am really hungry. What should I eat?*
- Use the poster to elicit an answer from the student, e.g. *Have some fried chicken.*
- Say to the second student *I am still hungry.* Elicit an answer, explaining that his/her answer must be different from that of the first student.
- Continue around the class, not allowing students to repeat an answer. If a student cannot think of an answer in 10 seconds, he/she is out.
- Continue until you run out of foods on the poster. At this point, have students think of other foods or play *Really Thirsty* with drinks.
- The last student left is the winner.

Large Class

Picnic Bingo

- Have each student draw a bingo card of 2 squares by 2 squares on a piece of paper.
- Make sure each student has four counters (coins, erasers, etc.)
- Tell them to quickly draw four items from the poster on their card. When they have finished, start the game.
- Randomly call items from the poster. If students have an item, they cover it with a counter.
- Continue until one student covers all four squares. This student calls out *Bingo!* and holds up their card. The winning student becomes the caller for the next game.
- Have students switch cards. The winning student then calls the next game with items from the poster.

Poster Activities B (for more advanced students)

Small Class

Missing Food

- Pick one of the items from the poster, but do not tell the students which one. Explain to them that someone has taken one of the items and they need to guess which one.
- Give students a clue, e.g. *It is a fruit*. Allow them to guess. Continue to give clues until one student guesses the item. That student gets to come up and pick the next item from the poster to describe.
- Play a variation of the game, by briefly showing the students the poster and then taking it down before giving the first clue. This variation will allow you to test to see if the students can remember the vocabulary and what was on the poster.

Large Class

Feed Me

- Divide the class into teams.
- Tell each team to pick 5 foods from the poster and write them on a piece of paper.
- Start the game when they are finished writing. Tell one member of team 1 to say to team 2, *I am hungry*. (You can also have them say, *We are hungry*, if you have taught this structure.)
- Team 2 needs to respond with *Have some...* They can pick any food from the poster. If team 1 has the food on their list, then they get to check it off.
- Move onto to team 2. Have one member say to team 3, *I am hungry*.
- Continue the activity, going around the room. Make sure teams do not repeat answers to try and keep another team from winning. The first team to check all the foods from their list wins.
